- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7
8 9 10 11 **Isaiah 6:9–10** - Messiah would fulfill, “10 Make the heart of this people dull, and their ears heavy, and blind their eyes; lest they see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and understand with their hearts, and turn and be healed.”
Fulfilled: Matt. 13:14–15 (explaining parables). Isaiah’s commission was Messiah’s commission “*Who will go for us?*”

8 9 10 11 **Isaiah 7:14** - Messiah would be born of a virgin and called Immanuel.
Fulfilled: Matt. 1:22–23
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7
8 9 10 11 **Isaiah 9:1–2** Messiah would be a light out of darkness
Fulfilled: Matt. 4:14–16; Luke 2:32 (John 1 “light of the world”)
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7
8 9 10 11 **Isaiah 9:1–2** - Jesus would dwell in “Capernaum . . . beyond Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles.”
Fulfilled: Matt. 4:13–15
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7
8 9 10 11 **Isaiah 9:6–7** - Jesus would be born and would receive divine names and the throne and kingdom. (Daniel 7:13–14)
Fulfilled: Matt. 1:21–23; Luke 1:32–33, Mark 9:1
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7
8 9 10 11 **Isaiah 11:1–5** - Jesus would be full of understanding and power.
Fulfilled: Matt. 3:16; John 3:34; Rom. 15:12
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7
8 9 10 11 **Isaiah 11:10** - “There shall be a root of Jesse, which shall stand for an ensign of the people; to it shall the Gentiles seek: and his rest shall be glorious.”
Fulfilled: Rom. 15:12
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7
8 9 10 11 **Isaiah 22:22** - Messiah would hold the key of David and possess the power to open and shut.
Fulfilled: Rev. 3:7
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7
8 9 10 11 **Isaiah 22:23** - A nail in a sure place refers to the crucifixion.
Fulfilled: Matt. 27:35
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7
8 9 10 11 **Isaiah 25:6–12** - “He will swallow up death in victory.”
Fulfilled: 1 Cor. 15:54

- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 **Isaiah 28:16** - Jesus would become a sure foundation and cornerstone
8 9 10 11 **Fulfilled:** Rom. 9:33; 1 Pet. 2:6
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 **Isaiah 40:3** - John would precede Jesus as “the voice crying in the wilderness.”
8 9 10 11 **Fulfilled:** Matt. 3:3
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 **Isaiah 45:1** - Cyrus called God’s “messiah”, as a forerunner because The Messiah, Jesus
8 9 10 11 Christ, would do eternally what Cyrus did temporarily. Set God’s people free from captivity and
exile.
Fulfilled: 2 Chron. 36:22–23, Gal. 5:1&13, Heb. 2:15, Ephe. 1:7
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 **Isaiah 49:6–12** - Jesus would be a light to the gentiles.
8 9 10 11 **Fulfilled:** Acts 13:47; 2 Cor. 6:2
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 **Isaiah 50:6** - Jesus would give His “back to the smiters” and hide not His “face from shame and
8 9 10 11 spitting.”
Fulfilled: Matt. 26:67; 27:26, 30
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 **Isaiah 52:13** - God will exalt Jesus.
8 9 10 11 **Fulfilled:** Phil. 2:9
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 **Isaiah 52:14** - Jesus would be disfigured.
8 9 10 11 **Fulfilled:** Matt. 26:67
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 **Isaiah 53:1** - “Who hath believed our report? and to whom is the arm of the Lord revealed?”
8 9 10 11 **Fulfilled:** John 12:38
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 **Isaiah 53:3** - Jesus would be despised and rejected.
8 9 10 11 **Fulfilled:** Mark 15:3–4, 29; Luke 23:1–25
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 **Isaiah 53:3–5** - “He was wounded for our transgressions . . . and with his stripes we are
8 9 10 11 healed.”
Fulfilled: 1 Cor. 15:3; 1 Pet. 2:24
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 **Isaiah 53:6** - “All we like sheep have gone astray.”
8 9 10 11 **Fulfilled:** 1 Pet. 2:25
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 **Isaiah 53:7** - Jesus would be silent before His accusers.
8 9 10 11 **Fulfilled:** Mark 14:60–61, 15:4–5; John 1:29; 11:49–52
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 **Isaiah 53:8** - Jesus would be sacrificed for the sins of the people.
8 9 10 11 **Fulfilled:** 2 Cor. 5:14–15
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 **Isaiah 53:5, 12** - “He was numbered with the transgressors.”
8 9 10 11 **Fulfilled:** Mark 15:27–28; John 12:37–38; Acts 8:28–35
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 **Isaiah 53:9** - “He made his grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death.”
8 9 10 11 **Fulfilled:** Matt. 27:57, 59–60; Acts 10:43; 13:38–39; 1 Cor. 15:3
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 **Isaiah 61:1–3** - Christ would be anointed to preach good tidings and to open the prison.
8 9 10 11 **Fulfilled:** Luke 4:17–19; Acts 10:38
- 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 **Isaiah 63:9** - Jesus would be afflicted.
8 9 10 11 **Fulfilled:** Matt. 25:34–40
